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2021 PARENT PAYMENT ARRANGEMENTS

Dear Parent/Carer,

Aurora School is looking forward to another great year of teaching and learning and would like to advise you of Aurora School's parent payment arrangements for 2021.

The Department of Education and Training (DET) has revised the Parent Payment Policy to allow for greater transparency of costs for all Victorian schools. Changes include itemised stationery list, breakdown of Essential Student Learning Items, Optional Items and suggested Voluntary contributions.

Please find the fee schedule for your child's class attached.

Payment is not required until the start of the 2021 school year. Payments may be made in full or per term.

Aurora School makes every effort to keep the cost of items and activities to a minimum and affordable for all parents. In order to maintain overall lower costs, the everyday essential items your child will use in the classroom are included in the attached list.

Financial Support for Families

Aurora School understands that some families may experience financial difficulty and offers a range of support options, including:

The following is a summary of the main principles of the Parent Payments Policy:



FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements as outlined in the Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.



PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

- Schools do not ask parents to pay for school operating costs (e.g. utility costs) or general and unspecified charges.

Essential Student Learning Items

- Items and activities which the school deems essential for student learning.
- Parents may choose to purchase essential items through the school or provide their own.

Optional Items

- Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are offered in addition to the standard curriculum.
- These are provided to students on a user-pays basis.

Voluntary Contributions

- Voluntary contributions support the school to continue to be the best local school for all students and can be for general or specific purpose.
- Students will not be disadvantaged in any way if parents do not make a contribution.

- Schools request payments from parents under three categories:



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

- Schools obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and upload their arrangements on their school's public website for transparency.
